### Restoration Commitment

- Manatee County Commission purchased the Powel Crosley Estate for 1.65 million in 1991.
- The Manatee Commission invested an additional 3.25 million dollars in renovation work over the past 14 years.
- The State of Florida Historic Preservation Department invested 1.2 million dollars in grant monies over the past 12 years.
- Seagate has received a half million dollars in private contributions since 1991.

**Total restoration commitment to date: \$6.6 million**

### Current Operating Status of Seagate

- The estate contracts over 100 public and private events per year.
- Over 50,000 people visit the estate on an annual basis.
- The estate generates an economic impact of over 4 million dollars per year to the local area.

### Continuing Restoration Needs

Total restoration of carriage house that will be utilized for the following:

1. Office space for the estate management, Crosley Foundation Inc., and the newly formed Powel Crosley Theatre Company.
2. Dormitory residence for contracted professional actors.
3. Laundry/Sewing room restoration to be used for dramatic performances at the estate.
4. Restoration of a three-car garage that will house a vintage Crosley car.
